

Texas Cancer Registry Studies of Somerville

The Texas Cancer Registry (TCR) has performed three separate studies of Somerville and Burleson county. The reports of these studies are publicly available from TCR. The conclusions of these publicly available documents are set forth below:

Summary of Investigation Into the Occurrence of Cancer; Zip Code 77879; Somerville; Burleson County, Texas; 1995-2003, July 24, 2006:

“The analysis of incidence data for zip code 77879, Somerville, Texas, from January 1, 1995-December 31, 2003 found cancers of the female breast, prostate, lung, colon and rectum, bladder, corpus and uterus, renal cell carcinoma, Hodgkin’s lymphoma, non-Hodgkin’s lymphoma, oral cavity and pharynx, esophagus, stomach, larynx, gliomas, childhood brain/CNS, childhood neuroblastoma, total leukemia, and selected leukemia subtypes to be within expected ranges in both males and females.”

Summary of Investigation Into the Occurrence of Cancer: Bastrop, Bell, Brazos, Burleson, Falls, Lee, Milam, Robertson, Travis and Williamson Counties, Texas; 1993-2002, August 8, 2005:

“The analysis of incidence data from Burleson County, Texas from January 1, 1995-December 31, 2002, and mortality data from January 1, 1993-December 31, 2002, found cancers of the breast, prostate, lung and bronchus, colon and rectum, corpus and uterus, bladder, non-Hodgkin’s lymphoma, kidney and renal pelvis, stomach, pancreas, and larynx to be within normal ranges in both males and females.”
